According to KSA 65-1627h, the Board is required to recoup the costs of administrative hearings when the decision is adverse to the licensee.

**SUMMARY ORDER**

**NOW** on January 5, 2026, comes before the Kansas State Board of Pharmacy through its Executive Secretary (hereinafter referred to as the "Board") the matter of the pharmacist license renewal application of Amer Abdelmaksoud (hereinafter referred to as "Respondent") to engage in the practice of pharmacy in the state of Kansas.

Pursuant to the authority granted to the Board by the Kansas Pharmacy Act, K.S.A. 65-1625, *et seq.*, and in accordance with the provisions of the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act, K.S.A. 77-501, *et seq.*, the Board enters this Summary Order in the above-captioned matter. After reviewing the renewal materials and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, the Board makes the following findings, conclusions, and order:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. On or around 6/30/2025, Respondent submitted a pharmacist license renewal application to engage in the practice of pharmacy in the State of Kansas.
2. In the renewal application, Respondent requested to renew the license on active status.
3. At the end of the renewal application, Respondent agreed to the following statement prior to submitting the completed renewal application: "I hereby attest that I have completed all ACPE/Board approved continuing education hours required by law to renew my license (Zero hours required for INACTIVE status). There is no grace period for completion of continuing education.

The hours must be completed within the licensed period, JULY 1, 2023 - JUNE 30, 2025. I declare under penalty of perjury under the laws of the State of Kansas that I have read and understand this application and that the information provided is true, correct, and complete to the best of my knowledge.”

4. Respondent did not complete the Board’s required one-hour continuing education course to renew Respondent’s pharmacist license.

#### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

5. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(9), the Board may deny, revoke, suspend, or place on probation any pharmacist license upon a finding that Respondent failed to comply with the continuing education requirements of the Board for license renewal.

6. Pursuant to K.A.R. 68-1-1b, 30 hours of continuing education shall be required for renewal of a pharmacist license during each licensure period, which must be obtained in the two-year licensure period ending on the June 30 expiration date of each license. Each licensee shall complete a 1-hour continuing education course provided by the Board, which shall be counted toward the 30-hour requirement.

7. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(1), the Board may deny, revoke, suspend, or place on probation any pharmacist license upon a finding that Respondent renewed or attempted to renew a license by false means, including misrepresentation.

8. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1658, in addition to any other penalty imposed by the Pharmacy Practice Act, the Board may assess a civil fine for a violation of K.S.A. 65-1627(a), in an amount not to exceed \$5,000 for each violation.

9. Respondent was required to complete the Board’s required continuing education course between July 1, 2023 and June 30, 2025.

10. Respondent failed to complete the required continuing education for renewal of

Respondent's license, in violation of K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(9).

11. Respondent falsely attested on the renewal application that Respondent had completed all continuing education hours required by law to renew Respondent's license, in violation of K.S.A. 65-1627(a)(1). Though material, the Board makes no finding about whether Respondent's misrepresentation was intentional.

### **ORDER**

Based on the foregoing findings of fact and conclusions of law, **Respondent is ordered to pay a \$500 fine by check or money order by February 20, 2026.**

Furthermore, if Respondent is not already signed up for the NABP CPE monitor (free version), Respondent shall create an NABP CPE monitor profile and shall ensure that proof of completion of all future required continuing education appears in the CPE monitor.

### **NOTICES**

Respondent is hereby notified as follows:

1. The Respondent may request a hearing pursuant to the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act by filing a written request with the Kansas Board of Pharmacy, 800 SW Jackson, Suite 1414, Topeka, KS 66612-1231 within fifteen (15) days after service of this order.

2. If a hearing is not requested as described above, the Order shall become a final order of the Board, effective upon the expiration of the time to request a hearing.

3. Within fifteen (15) days after entry of a final agency order, either party may file a petition for reconsideration pursuant to K.S.A. 77-529.

4. Within the time limits established in K.S.A. 77-613, either party may seek judicial review of a final agency order, pursuant to said statute. The agency officer designated to receive service of a petition for judicial review is:




