**SUMMARY ORDER**

NOW on this 28th day of January, 2026 comes before the Kansas Board of Pharmacy (the “Board”), through its Executive Secretary, the matter of Dandurand Compounding, Inc. (“Respondent”).

Pursuant to the authority granted to the Board by the Kansas Pharmacy Act, K.S.A. 65-1625, *et seq.*, and in accordance with the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act, K.S.A. 77-501, *et seq.*, the Board’s Executive Secretary enters this Summary Order in the above-captioned matter. After reviewing the investigation materials and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, makes the following findings, conclusions and order:

**FINDINGS OF FACT**

1. The Board has previously issued Respondent Registration No. 2-105147 which entitles Respondent to function as a Pharmacy in the State of Kansas (“Respondent’s Registration”).
2. On August 2, 2025, the Board received K-TRACS submissions from Respondent for dispensed prescriptions.
3. Upon receipt and processing of K-TRACS submissions, the Board’s vendor identifies any submission data errors (i.e., incomplete patient address) and immediately sends an automated notification email to the reporter’s designated K-TRACS clearinghouse email requesting correction of the errors.

4. On August 12, 2025, the Board sent an email to Respondent's Pharmacist-in-Charge ("PIC") with a notification that Respondent's prescription records submitted to K-TRACS on August 2, 2025 included errors for four prescriptions that had not been corrected within the seven-day requirement. The email provided instructions for correcting the errors.

5. On August 14, 2025, Respondent corrected the outstanding errors.

6. On August 28, 2025, the Board sent an email to Respondent's Pharmacist-in-Charge ("PIC") with a notification that Respondent's prescription records submitted to K-TRACS on August 21, 2025 included errors for two prescriptions that had not been corrected within the 7-day requirement. The email provided instructions for correcting the errors.

7. On August 29, 2025, Respondent corrected the outstanding errors.

8. On September 8, 2025, the Board sent an email to Respondent's Pharmacist-in-Charge ("PIC") with a notification that Respondent's prescription records submitted to K-TRACS on August 29, 2025 included errors for three prescriptions that had not been corrected within the 7-day requirement. The email provided instructions for correcting the errors.

9. On September 9, 2025, Respondent corrected the outstanding errors.

10. On September 18, 2025, the Board sent an email to Respondent's Pharmacist-in-Charge ("PIC") with a notification that Respondent's prescription records submitted to K-TRACS on September 10, 2025 included errors for two prescriptions and on September 11, 2025 included errors for one prescription that had not been corrected within the 7-day requirement. The email provided instructions for correcting the errors.

11. On September 19, 2025, Respondent corrected the outstanding errors.

12. On September 30, 2025, the Board sent an email to Respondent's Pharmacist-in-Charge ("PIC") with a notification that Respondent's prescription records submitted to K-TRACS included errors that had not been corrected within the 7-day requirement, including the following:

- a) errors for two prescriptions submitted to K-TRACS on September 20, 2025;
- b) errors for four prescriptions submitted to K-TRACS on September 23, 2025; and
- c) errors for two prescriptions submitted to K-TRACS on September 24, 2025.

13. On October 1, 2025, Respondent corrected the outstanding errors.

14. On October 2, 2025, Respondent submitted two prescription records to K-TRACS with errors.

#### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1658, the Board may assess a civil fine not to exceed \$5,000, after notice and an opportunity to be heard, to any registrant for violation of the pharmacy act of the state of Kansas or any other rules or regulations of the state board of pharmacy.

2. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(e)(1), the Board may limit, condition, revoke, suspend or place in a probationary status the registration of a pharmacy upon a finding that such pharmacy has been operated in such manner that violations of the provisions of the pharmacy act of the state of Kansas or of the rules and regulations of the Board have occurred in connection therewith.

3. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(e)(9), the Board may limit, condition, revoke, suspend or place in a probationary status the registration of a pharmacy upon a finding that such pharmacy has been operated in such manner that the violations of the provisions of the prescription monitoring program act of the state of Kansas or any rule and regulation of the board have occurred in connection therewith.

4. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1683, each pharmacy shall submit to the Board by electronic means information required by the Board regarding each prescription dispensed for a scheduled substance or drug of concern, including the patient's name, address, date of birth, and other required prescription information.

5. Pursuant to K.A.R. 68-21-2, each pharmacy shall correct any reporting error within seven days of being notified of the error by the Board or the Board's designee.

6. On August 2<sup>nd</sup>, 21<sup>st</sup>, 29<sup>th</sup>, September 10<sup>th</sup>, 11<sup>th</sup>, 20<sup>th</sup>, 23<sup>rd</sup>, 24<sup>th</sup>, and October 2<sup>nd</sup>, Respondent submitted prescription reports to K-TRACS for 22 unique prescriptions with errors due to missing or incorrect prescription information.

7. By failing to submit all of the required prescription record information to K-TRACS for 22 prescriptions by the next business day, Respondent violated K.S.A. 65-1683, which is a basis to take action against Respondent's Registration pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(e)(1) and (e)(9).

8. Upon receiving automated notification of errors from the Board's designee, Respondent failed to correct the reporting errors within seven days. Correction timelines are as follows:

- a) August 2, 2025 submission errors corrected on August 14, 2025 – 5 days beyond 7-day requirement for 4 prescription records.
- b) August 21, 2025 submission errors corrected on August 29, 2025 – 1 day beyond 7-day requirement for 2 prescription records.
- c) August 29, 2025 submission errors corrected on September 9, 2025 – 4 days beyond 7-day requirement for 3 prescription records.

- d) September 10, 2025 submission errors corrected on September 19, 2025 – 2 days beyond 7-day requirement for 2 prescription records.
  - e) September 11, 2025 submission errors corrected on September 19, 2025 – 1 day beyond 7-day requirement for 1 prescription record.
  - f) September 20, 2025 submission errors corrected on October 1, 2025 – 4 days beyond 7-day requirement for 2 prescription records.
  - g) September 23, 2025 submission errors corrected on October 1, 2025 – 1 day beyond 7-day requirement for 4 prescription records.
9. By failing to correct 18 K-TRACS reports within seven days, Respondent violated K.A.R. 68-21-2, which is a basis to take action against Respondent’s Registration pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1627(e)(1) and (e)(9).

ORDER

Based upon the foregoing findings of fact and conclusions of law, Respondent is ordered to pay a fine to the Board in the amount of \$1,010. Respondent has 30 days from the date of this order to pay the fine.

NOTICES

The Respondent is hereby notified as follows:

- 1. The Respondent may request a hearing pursuant to the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act by filing a written request with the Kansas Board of Pharmacy, 800 SW Jackson, Suite 1414, Topeka, KS 66612-1231 within fifteen (15) days after service of this order.
- 2. If a hearing is not requested as described above, the Order shall become a final order of the Board, effective upon the expiration of the time to request a hearing.

3. Within fifteen (15) days after entry of a final agency order, either party may file a petition for reconsideration pursuant to K.S.A. 77-529.


4. Within the time limits established in K.S.A. 77-613, either party may seek judicial review of a final agency order, pursuant to said statute. The agency officer designated to receive service of a petition for judicial review is:
